



# Maintaining Public Confidence and Trust in the Work of Surveyors:

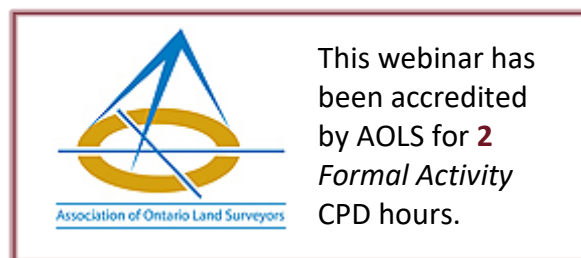
## A Perspective from Newfoundland and Labrador
